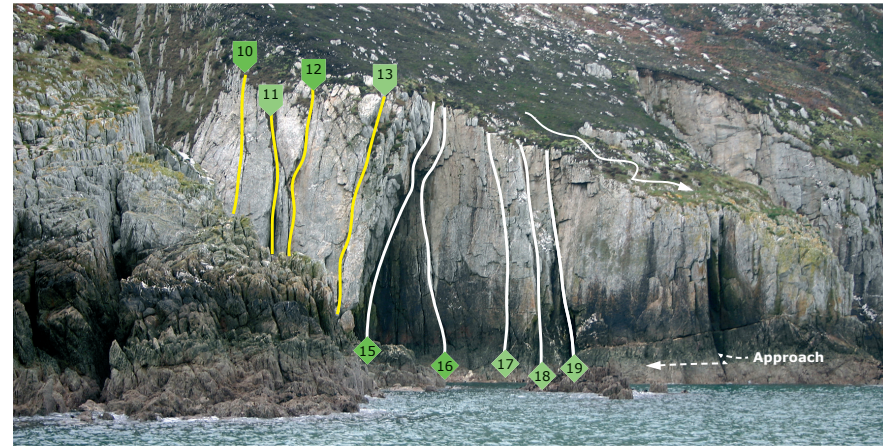




## West Wall

On the opposite side of the zawn to *A Groove* and *Another Groove*, there are 2 attractive slabby walls broken by a large vertical overlap which hides an ominous looking chimney cleft (*Tidal Wave*) at its back edge. A number of good routes can be found here. Approach, either by traversing across the zawn from the east side, or by descending the slope above down to a broken area to the right of the climbs leading down to sea level, and then traversing back left to the base of the routes. A low tide is recommended. Belays at the top of this section of the zawn are scarce.

- ▶ **10. Cracked Slab HVS 4c** 28m  
Start at a crack, left of the chimney on the left side of the left hand wall. Climb the main crack, and then head up leftwards via a flaky crack, finishing on poor rock. Take care on the last section.

- ▶ **11. Chimney Climb VS 4c** 25m  
The obvious chimney on the left side of the left hand wall.

- ▶ **12. Overlapped Groove E1 5b** 25m  
Follow the crack just to the right of *Chimney Climb* until it divides. The right fork takes you into a small groove, which leads to the top.

- ▶ **13. Crackers VS 4c** 25m  
Just left of the right arête of the left hand wall, there is an obvious crack and groove system. Climb this trending rightwards to a blocky vegetated finish.

- ▶ **14. Sirplum E2 5c** 25m  
Climb the crack in the narrow overhanging wall just left of the *Tidal Wave* chimney cleft, to finish near *Crackers*. [J Brown, D H Jones 1987]



- ▶ **15. Tidal Wave E2 5b** \* 30m  
The large chimney cleft marking the left corner of the right hand slabby wall yields a route of much character. Traverse out from the back to finish up a steep groove.

  - ▶ **16. Cracked Up E1 5b** 25m  
Start just right of *Tidal Wave*, and follow a crack up the wall, moving right under the overlaps at the top, until it is possible to exit directly.

  - ▶ **17. The Crack VS** 21m  
The crackline 5m left of *The Chimney*.

  - ▶ **18. The Groove VS 4c** \* 21m  
The slanting groove, just left of *The Chimney* provides a fine route.

  - ▶ **19. The Chimney S** 21m  
The obvious chimney cleft 16m right of *Tidal Wave*.

- Immediately west of Tsunami Zawn is a small zawn with an intriguing cave feature. There are no routes in here (yet), perhaps because sections of the rock look a little suspect? Further west towards North Stack there is another bay, and right again is a tibia shaped arête, left of a roofed square groove:
- ▶ **20. God's Bone XS 6b** 10m  
The tibia shaped arête, which is climbed on its left side, has no relevant gear. Although at high tide it is a 'safe' deep water solo.
